Dear Parents/Whanau/Caregivers. We nearly lost one of our own this week on the road in front of the school.

We are <u>all</u> responsible for the safety of our children. My staff and a growing number of parents are <u>horrified</u> at the risky behaviour of some of our parents. The cones being put out each afternoon are the only way we can stop some of our parents from parking on the yellow lines and blocking the line of sight for our children using the crossing. Police and Auckland Transport have been regularly contacted about traffic issues and the dangerous & careless behaviour of a few - including those who park in the bus stop, forcing the bus that comes along just after 3.00 pm to have to stop in the middle of the road to let off passengers, adding to the chaos outside our gates.

As adults we all need to model safe behaviour. *Please do not park across the road and call your child across or stand in the middle of the road and walk them back across. Use the crossing - young children are watching you!*
