## Road Safety Week

The theme of Road Safety Week 2023 (15-21 May) is Be a road safety hero, recognising everyone who helps to make our roads safer and support people after a crash, and explaining how we can all play a part in making journeys safer for everyone.

Everyone can be a Road Safety Hero. Road Safety Week 2023 recognises everyone who is working to make our roads safer and support people following crashes - from emergency services to health professionals, transport engineers to school crossing patrols, road workers to community campaigners. It also enables everyone who uses roads to understand how they can take responsibility for their own safety and the safety of others.

The staff and parents are often 'sick to the stomach' about the selfish driving decisions of a few. You are putting the children of West Harbour School at great risk!!! We have had to cone off the driveway so children can use the footpath safely. Some examples of the bad driving that we witness on a daily basis are:

- Letting your child out of the car on the road side of the car
- Parking facing the wrong way, then doing multi-maneuvers so you can go back the way you came. TRY DRIVING AROUND THE BLOCK
- Not bringing your child to the crossing so they can cross safely
- Parking over footpaths
- Parking on yellow lines
- Doing u-turns
- Tooting at your child so they can run across the road to you
- Not wearing seatbelts
- Glaring at our staff who are only trying to keep your children safe

## Suggestions:

- Use the other two entrances on Hueglow Rise and Sumich Place, rather than the front of the school
- Park further down Oreil Avenue, on the school side, and either walk your children to school or watch them until they reach the gates
- In the afternoon park further down the road and walk up to the gates to meet your children or arrange for them to walk to you, making sure that they know to use the crossing

PLEASE NOTE: We are partnering with Auckland Transport and the Police to keep our children alive.
