WELCOME TO WEST HARBOUR SCHOOL

The setting sun positions our school in its location- to the west of the Waitemata Harbour. It is also a tribute to the history of West Harbour School as the setting sun has featured on our past emblems and signage. The arches reflect the school's geographical position also.
They symbolise the learning journeys our tamariki and their whanau are involved in – now and in the future!

The **BLUE** arch represents the waters of our Manutewhau Stream which flows past the school to the Waitemata Harbour. The bark of the whau tree was used by local Maori to float their hooks while fishing. This arch pays respect to our local history, to the Tangata Whenua and to the environment.

The **BLACK** arch represents our local motorway. It symbolises the connections within and beyond our learning community and links to technology and the economic developments of the area.

The GOLD arch represents our local bridge across the motorway. It reminds us about the importance of 'bridging' between the worlds of our students, whanau, community and the school; it shows there will be a way over obstacles and another pathway to their futures.




WEST HARBOUR SCHOOL FRAMEWORK


